Requirements of the Ph.D. Study Board for newly approved supervisors

Applications from new supervisors for their appointment are considered individually by the Ph.D. Study Board. Following documents are evaluated: an application, a curriculum vitae, a list of publications (must include unique identifiers such as ORCID or Researcher ID), and an annotation of the topic in which the applicant is to become a supervisor. In the case of applicants without academic tenure (without habilitation) or who have not yet supervised Ph.D. students under other Ph.D. study boards, the following criteria will be taken into account:

- Time elapsed since obtaining the Ph.D. degree: at least 2 years
- Publication activity in the last 5 years:
 - At least 3-4 publications in journals with IF according to Web of Science
 - The positions of first, corresponding, and last (senior) author are considered to be a significant advantage in assessing the competence of the supervisor to coach the students in academic writing
- Quality of annotation of the proposed topic
- Facilities available for scientific work and professional growth of Ph.D. students, namely: equipment of the training facility, available methods, involvement of students in ongoing or new projects, etc.
- Conditions promoting international cooperation and professional growth of Ph.D. students in an international environment: internship opportunities, contacts with institutes abroad
- Clarification of the methods of financing Ph.D. students' work
- Other circumstances, e.g.:
 - the applicant's contribution to projects in the field of science and research
 - the applicant's international scientific experience: joint publications with international institutions, internships, participation in international conferences
 - active membership in scientific societies, organisational activity in organising scientific events, seminars, conferences
 - membership in the editorial board of journals with standard peer review procedure
 - recommendation from an important scientific personality from the Czech Republic or abroad or a member of a Ph.D. Study board
